Section 4. The North Takes Charge  
One American Story: Frank Averis Haskell was a Union officer at the Gettysburg battle who observed the Confederates as they marched toward them.  
**Armed Clash at Gettysburg:**  
**Gettysburg, Pennsylvania:** A three-day battle occurred and resulted in Southern loss. The Confederates army was crippled so badly by the battle that General Lee would never be able to invade a Northern state again.  
**Prelude to Gettysburg:**  
**Charlottesville, Virginia:** the south defeated the North.  
**Shenandoah:** Jackson was accidentally shot in the arm by his own men. He later died of pneumonia. → Lee decides to invade the North.  
**Gettysburg:**  
Confederate soldiers want to find shelter on Gettysburg and set up with Northern troops → Mealy battle → South loses because North has higher ground.  
**Cemetery Ridge:** the high ground south of Gettysburg.  
**The Second Day:**  
Lee ordered his soldiers to attack Cemetery Ridge.  
Little Round Top: a hill that overlooked much of the southern portion of the battlefield.  
..... What were the Rebels??? Abolitionists??? Yankees??? Pickett's Charge.....  
**Pickett's Charge:** Confederates never the Union.  
**The Third Day:**  
Lee attacks again → Yankees fire at them → Lee retreats.  
Thousands of men died on both sides.  
South suffers an extreme loss.  
**Great Wins at Vicksburg:**  
**Vicksburg, Mississippi:** one of only two Confederate holdouts preventing the Union from taking complete control of the Mississippi River, an important waterway for transporting goods.  
**Vicksburg Under Siege:**  
Union attracts confederates by sending a cavalry brigade to Mississippi → Union wins.  
Confederates starved and were low on supplies → Vicksburg surrenders.  
**The Gettysburg Address:**  
Edward Everett gave a two-hour speech prior to that of Lincoln.  
**Gettysburg Address:** Lincoln's two-minute speech which was delivered at the dedication of the Soldiers National Cemetery at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Lincoln.
